A great point guard does it all.

He is the proverbial straw that stirs the drink – the man pushing the pace, controlling the tempo, and setting up his teammates. He is the extension of the coach on the court – the man talking to his teammates, whether to calm them down or pump them up. He is constantly communicating.

It's no surprise then that Chris Wilson, the 6-foot-3 left-handed junior from Fayetteville, North Carolina, tries to incorporate all of these characteristics into his ever-evolving repertoire.

"I just want to be a better point guard overall," he said when asked what he still needs to improve. "Any team with a tough

point guard is a hard team to beat. You find a team with a really solid point guard, more than likely they're going to be a good basketball team."

Wilson studied point guards growing up. He mentioned Jason Kidd and Deron Williams specifically when asked about players he looked up to and you can see their influences in the way he orchestrates the offense on the floor.

"I loved Jason Kidd's game. He was always in control. He always got the shot he wanted for his teammates," he said. "He could dominate the game without even shooting the basketball. Deron Williams is so physical and strong and plays with a great pace."

Kidd notoriously came into the NBA lacking a consistent jumpshot before becoming one of the most successful three-point shooters in history. Like his idol, Wilson has improved steadily every season from the field. After shooting 36% as a freshman, he's now up to 41% as a junior, including a career-best 37% from three-point range.

He's managed to score overall with more frequency this season, averaging a career-best 9.6 points per game, while keeping his assist totals around his career average of three per game. He is second on the team in minutes played, fourth in field goal attempts and second in assists.

The Hawks have four players who average double figures. That balanced attack steered by Wilson is one of the reasons the Hawks currently sit tied for second in the Atlantic 10.

"That's a beautiful thing," he said.

He recognizes his improvement, particularly on his outside shot, but it's his improvement with the mental aspects of the game that he's most proud of; in particular, his ability to shake off a mistake.

"I would let a bad play turn into a bad half just because I was so hard on myself," he said. "I had to learn that at this level, bad plays happen, but it's about how you bounce back."

Wilson was a standout while in high school in Fayetteville. As a state, North Carolina is known primarily for their big-name collegiate programs; however there is plenty

of homegrown talent as well. Look no further than Wilson and his teammate, Charlotte-raised DeAndre' Bembry.

"It's highly competitive, whether it's a public school or a private school," Wilson said. "Top to bottom, it's great. Your average high school player [in North Carolina] is a solid, fundamental, good, tough basketball player. It is a huge part of North Carolina."

He attended Terry Sanford High School, where he amassed 1,527 points, 455 assists, and a 112-12 record during his time there. He was named the 2011 Player of the Year for District 4, the Cape Fear Region and the Mid-South Conference. He also had the prestigious honor of being the first male player in school history to have his jersey retired.

With his decorated high school résumé in tow, he made the decision to come to Saint Joseph's because of his relationships with the coaching staff and the fact that he knew he would have the opportunity to contribute from day one. He played in all 33 games as a freshman.

"I didn't want anything to be given to me, but I wanted to go somewhere where I knew I would have a fair opportunity to play early in my career," he said. "Coach always kept it straight and honest with me. He told me, 'We need a true point guard; somebody that can run the show, somebody that can bring leadership and toughness.' And that's what I've tried to do from day one."

In addition, he recognized the wealth of young talent that was already in place. Halil

Wilson and the Hawks have shown their talent on the court this season, but they know it's just the first step. "We still have so much left to prove," he said. "We're really hungry to keep improving. I feel like we haven't played our best basketball yet."

Kanacevic, Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts and Daryus Quarles were already on Hawk Hill, and the chance to play with them was something Wilson couldn't pass up.

"All those guys were sophomores, so I knew I had a great opportunity to come in with other young talent and have a chance to build something. I wanted to be a part of something special."

This season, those seniors provide a tremendous veteran presence. That doesn't stop Wilson from stepping up and taking on a leadership role on and off the court.

"I'm definitely a very vocal guy," he said. "I'm always talking, whether it's in practice, in the game, or one-on-one with a teammate. I would definitely consider myself one of the leaders of the team."

When those seniors graduate in May, the program will look to Wilson, as well as Papa Ndao, DeAndre' Bemby and others, to shoulder the load next season.

"I told them that on Senior Night I might cry," he said with a laugh. "It's going to be tough playing without them next year."

"What he's done for our city is amazing," Wilson said. "Not just with the music, but what he's done working with the youth there. He's really trying to make the city better. I really respect that."

The Hawks are entering the final leg of their season, having won 14 out of their last 17 games. They are hitting their stride just in time.

"We know how this thing can go," he said. "You can fall off and not get exactly where you want or you can keep grinding. You can really push yourself to improve as a team and individually and see where you end up. That's our mindset."
