As the Philadelphia area was getting rocked with a blizzard 10 days ago that blanketed the area with nearly eight inches of fresh snow, and the Philadelphia Eagles basked in the glory of their victory in their instant classic "Snow Bowl" game against the Detroit Lions, the Saint Joseph's Hawks were reeling from their difficult loss against the rival Villanova Wildcats.

The Hawks are perched at 4-4 nearly a third of the way through the young season. After losing their last two games against Big 5 rivals Temple and the aforementioned Villanova, the Hawks find themselves in a position where they're looking to get back on the winning path. It's a challenge that they're ready to attack.

Saint Joseph's guard Evan Maschmeyer knows all about overcoming challenges.

The 6-foot-3 junior from Jeffersonville, Indiana, missed the first 11 games of the 2012-13 season with a fractured right hand. After being activated on December 31, Maschmeyer played in just 12 games for the Hawks, contributing off the bench in victories against Atlantic 10 opponents Rhode Island, Fordham, and Xavier.

It's always difficult returning to action from a serious injury, even more so when it's in the beginning of the season and you're fighting for more minutes. In the face of adversity, Maschmeyer remained steadfast in his rehabilitation and met the challenge head on.

"It was really difficult to sit out that time," he said, looking back on last season. "When I came back it was hard just to get into a rhythm and get used to the speed of the game again after sitting out so long. It took me a couple games to feel comfortable."

Maschmeyer was a three-time All-Conference and All-Area selection while at Jeffersonville High School in Indiana. As a senior he averaged 15.2 points, 3.1 rebounds, and 6.7 assists per game. Ever the floor general, he led the team in assists all four years.

Playing high school basketball in Indiana is a lot like playing high school football in Texas. It's a big deal. The fans care. The towns care. The Hoosier State is truly a mecca for high school hoops. Maschmeyer lived it, and loved every second of it.

"It's a very big deal," he said. "It's by far the most important sport [in the state]. It was a really neat experience."

Maschmeyer's high school home games would sell out a 5,000-seat arena, while on the road at some rival schools the attendance could reach almost 9,000, depending on the capacity of that particular school's gym. That's a lot of eyeballs on high school hoops.

He had his eye close to the college hoops scene in Indiana as well. He would study and seek inspiration from one of Indiana's favorite sons, former Indiana Hoosier Eric Gordon, currently of the New Orleans Pelicans.

"I was a huge Eric Gordon fan," he recalled. "He was my favorite player. I was probably in 7th and 8th grade at the time when I would see him play on the AAU circuit."

In his senior season at Jeffersonville, Maschmeyer got injured before the first game of the year. This wasn't the way he was supposed to follow up his excellent junior season. With uncertainty clouding his potential future at some mid-major colleges in Indiana, he dabbled with the idea of attending prep school before Saint Joseph's eventually swooped in late in the recruiting process. Hawk Hill was a perfect match for him.

"Saint Joseph's kind of came in towards the end," he said. "I took a visit here and really enjoyed the campus and the coaching staff. I think it became a really good fit."

Much like Indiana, Philadelphia has a proud basketball tradition. That pride is on full display at every Big 5 game, particularly here inside Hagan Arena, thanks in part to the loudest student section in the city. This energy and passion is one aspect of Saint Joseph's that Maschmeyer completely identifies with.

"Everyone is so enthusiastic about basketball [at SJU]," he said. "When I drove to our pre-game meal before the Villanova game, I saw students lined up outside [hours before the game]."

"They always come out and show great support for any event we have. I'm not sure we as players could thank them enough."

So far this season, he's appeared in seven of the team's eight games, scoring a season-high four points against Siena at the Old Spice Classic in Orlando, Florida.

Maschmeyer has already begun to think about his post-basketball career options. The finance major is looking for an internship this summer.

With the Hawks ready to dive head first into the core of their schedule after an 11-day layoff, Maschmeyer is ready to contribute whenever his number is called.

"[I just want to] help the team," he said. "Not necessarily scoring, but making defensive plays, getting rebounds, being a spark off the bench."

There's still a lot of basketball left to play this season and the Hawks have given the fan base glimpses of the type of game they want to play in order to be successful this

season. Keeping that focus and consistency is a priority.

"We're still in the process of figuring things out," he explained. "I think if we continue preparing and working the way we have, we're going to [be able to] put together a good streak of wins and get on a roll."
